KOZYAK TROPIN & THROCKMORTON, P.A.'S TENTH REQUEST FOR INTERIM COMPENSATION TO PAY ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS AND MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

(November 1, 2007 - February 29, 2008)

Pursuant to Court Order, all objections to this Tenth Application must be filed and served within ten (10) days of this Tenth Application.

David L. Rosendorf, a Shareholder of Kozyak Tropin & Throckmorton, P.A. ("KTT") submits this Tenth Application for an award of interim attorney's fees and costs incurred by KTT as counsel to the Receiver, Roberto Martínez (the "Receiver") for the period November 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008 (the "Application Period").

KTT submits this Tenth Application at the request of the Receiver. This Application reflects KTT's agreement to reduce its fees by \$1,575.75 based on the reduction of KTT's billing rates from the firm's normal hourly rates (which reductions were reflected in the original fee application). This reduction is without prejudice to KTT making a future application to recover the reduction based on results obtained and the success of the Receivership.

In support of this Tenth Application, the undersigned submits the following:

- 1. Attached as Exhibit "1" is a Summary of the Fees incurred by KTT in its representation of the Receiver for the Application Period. Costs are posted through February 29, 2008.
- 2. Attached as Exhibit "2" is a summary of all KTT timekeepers, their billing rates and the total hours that were charged by each timekeeper. Exhibit "3" is a summary of each time-keeper broken down by category. All time has been billed at the reduced agreed upon rate. All partners are billed at \$350.00/hour. All non-partner timekeepers are billed at 15% below their regular hourly billing rate. As set forth above, savings to the receivership reflected in these negotiated discounts for

KTT maintains detailed time records that are kept contemporaneously with the services performed. KTT will retain its detailed time records and will provide them to the Court for review *in camera* at the request of this Court.

this time period is approximately \$1,575.75. In certain instances, time billed to one category could have been appropriately billed to a different category or several different categories, however, in some instances it was very difficult, if not impossible, to divide the time between categories.

- 3. Attached as **Exhibit "4"** is the summary of costs. Total costs for which KTT seeks reimbursement are \$979.94.
  - 4. The services rendered in each major category can be summarized as follows:
- a. Asset Disposition. [\$53,470.50]. During the application period, KTT worked on consummation of the sale of the Bid 2 portfolio having a face value of approximately \$175 million to Silver Point Capital Fund, L.P., reviewed and revised the asset purchase agreement, participated in communications with the Receiver and counsel for Silver Point concerning modifications to the closing documents for Bid 2 portfolio and release of escrow funds to complete the \$11 million sale. In addition, KTT negotiated the proposed sale of other policies, including the negotiation and preparation of an Asset Purchase Agreement and drafting of the Motion to Approve Sale of Policy AP#99-0007778 (the "Sale Motion") having a face value of \$50 million, and conferred with Receiver and Silver Point concerning finalizing the Sale Motion. A draft notice of the proposed sale to all investors and interested parties was also prepared.

KTT worked on the brokerage agreement and accompanying motion to retain Life Settlement Insights, LLC ("LSI") to conduct the auctions of certain policies, including fractional interest policies, which were designated to be kept by the investors through the disposition process but for which the investors did not pay the required premiums (referred to as "Undersubscribed Keep Policies"). On January 22, 2008, the Court approved the engagement of LSI. A further motion to

provide for their engagement and procedure for sales of fractional interests was also negotiated and drafted.

KTT attended a meeting with interested buyers to negotiate the potential acquisition of Viatical Services, Inc. ("VSI") and drafted a confidentiality agreement in connection with same.

- b. <u>Business Operations</u>. [\$2,635.00]. KTT's efforts in this area focused on the continued assistance in the management of the operations of the Receivership Entities and resolving issues with banks.
- c. <u>Investor and Agent Communications</u>. [\$1,211.25]. KTT continues to assist the Receiver with investor communications.
- d. <u>Case Administration</u>. [\$6,205.75]. KTT attended a couple of meetings with the Receiver and staff to address pending issues, participated in discussions concerning the draft notice regarding order for procedures for changing beneficial interests, and coordinating the mailing of notice to investors and various insurance companies.
- e. <u>Claims Administration and Objections</u> [\$6,825.00]. The Receiver realized that the defrauded investors would assert claims against the Receivership Entities for their substantial losses in this viatical fraud. In order for the investors to receive a distribution, KTT drafted a Motion to Approve Proposed Claims Process which would authorize the Receiver to commence implementing the process for submission and resolution of claims against the Receivership Entities. KTT conferred with Receiver and the SEC concerning the draft motion.
- f. <u>Fee/Employment Applications (Professionals)</u>. [\$1,539.25]. This application period includes reviewing KTT's internal billings and properly categorizing same, in addition to

preparing KTT's Ninth Interim Fee Application.

- g. <u>General Litigation</u>. [\$3,857.50]. KTT continously reviews incoming pleadings and monitors the Drinker Biddle appeal.
- 5. For the Application Period, KTT seeks reimbursement for 237.4 hours of attorney and paraprofessional time. The total amount of fees sought during the application period is \$75,744.25, reflecting the negotiated discounts totaling approximately \$1,575.75. Total expenses sought by KTT for the application period are \$979.94.
- 6. I have carefully reviewed the attached exhibits and I am responsible for supervising all of the attorneys in my firm on the case. I certify that the hours expended and the costs incurred were necessary and reasonable to represent the Receiver during the Application Period.

#### MEMORANDUM OF LAW

When determining the award of attorneys' fees, the Court should give consideration to the factors for compensation that the Eleventh Circuit articulated in *Norman v. Housing Authority of City of Montgomery*, 836 F.2d 1292 (11th Cir. 1988) - (1) the time and labor properly employed by the attorneys in processing the case; (2) the quality of services rendered; (3) the scope of the activity and conspiracy under attack; (4) the financial risk involved; (5) the magnitude, complexity and novelty of the issues involved; (6) the beneficial results obtained; and (6) the degree to which, if any, effort were supported by prior governmental action. KTT respectfully suggests that its application meets all of the criteria for this interim request for compensation. The Receiver, with the assistance of KTT, has stabilized operations, secured assets, sought to reduce expenses, and begin the disposition process, which is a critical condition precedent to distributing assets to the investors.

WHEREFORE, KOZYAK, TROPIN & THROCKMORTON, P.A., by and through undersigned counsel, respectfully requests that this Court enter an Order Authorizing the Payment of \$75,744.25 in fees and reimbursement of \$979.94 in costs for the Application Period. A proposed form of Order is attached.
